



ADVANCED PAIN MANAGEMENT

PATIENT'S BILL OF RIGHTS

ADVANCED PAIN MANAGEMENT ENDORSES A PATIENT'S BILL OF RIGHTS. IT IS AN EXPECTATION THAT COMPLIANCE WITH THE PATIENT'S BILL OF RIGHTS CAN CONTRIBUTE TO AN EFFECTIVE PROGRAM FOR THE PATIENT. A MODIFICATION OF THE AMERICAN HOSPITAL ASSOCIATION'S STATEMENT ON A PATIENT'S BILL OF RIGHTS HAS BEEN INCORPORATED AS PART OF THE FRAMEWORK OF THE AMERICAN ACADEMY OF PAIN MANAGEMENT.

THE MODIFICATION CONSISTS OF THE FOLLOWING:

1. THE PATIENT HAS THE RIGHT TO CONSIDERATE AND RESPECTFUL CARE.
2. THE PATIENT HAS THE RIGHT TO OBTAIN FROM THEIR CREDENTIALLED PRACTITIONER
3. COMPLETE AND CURRENT INFORMATION CONCERNING THE DIAGNOSIS, PROPOSED TREATMENT AND EXPECTED PROGNOSIS IN TERMS THAT THE PATIENT MAY REASONABLY BE EXPECTED TO UNDERSTAND. WHEN IT IS NOT ADVISABLE TO GIVE SUCH INFORMATION TO THE PATIENT, THE INFORMATION SHOULD BE MADE AVAILABLE TO AN APPROPRIATE PERSON (MEDICAL PROXY) ON THE PATIENT'S BEHALF.
4. THE PATIENT HAS THE RIGHT TO RECEIVE THE NECESSARY INFORMATION FOR MEDICAL DECISION MAKING AND THE GRANTING OF INFORMED CONSENT FROM THE TREATING CREDENTIALLED PRACTITIONER PRIOR TO THE START OF ANY PROCEDURE OR TREATMENT. THIS INFORMATION SHALL INCLUDE AT THE MINIMUM: THE EXPECTED TREATMENT OR PROCEDURE TO BE USED, WHO WILL PERFORM THE TREATMENT OR PROCEDURE, WHAT ARE THE LIKELY BENEFITS OF THE TREATMENT OR PROCEDURE, WHAT ALTERNATIVES EXIST IF ANY, WHAT ARE THE LIKELY RISKS FROM THE PROCEDURE OR TREATMENT, WHAT MAY OCCUR IF NO TREATMENT IS UNDERTAKEN AND LENGTH OF PROBABLE DURATION OF INCAPACITATION OF ANY IS EXPECTED.
5. THE PATIENT HAS THE RIGHT TO REFUSE ANY AND ALL TREATMENT TO THE EXTENT PERMITTED BY LAW, AND TO BE INFORMED OF ANY MEDICAL CONSEQUENCES OF THIS ACTION.
6. THE PATIENT HAS THE RIGHT TO BE ADVISED IF THE PRACTITIONER, AGENCY OR FACILITY PROPOSED TO ENGAGE IN ANY FORM OF HUMAN EXPECTATION AFFECTING THE CARE OR TREATMENT PROVIDED. THE PATIENT HAS THE RIGHT TO REFUSE TO PARTICIPATE IN RESEARCH PROJECTS OR TO WITHDRAW CONTINUED CONSENT TO PARTICIPATE WITHOUT REPERCUSSIONS.
7. THE PATIENT HAS THE RIGHT TO EXAMINE AND RECEIVE AN EXPLANATION OF THE BILL FOR PROFESSIONAL SERVICES RENDERED.

ALL PAIN MANAGEMENT ACTIVITIES ARE TO BE PROVIDED WITH AN OVERRIDING CONCERN FOR THE PATIENT AND ABOVE ALL, WITH RECOGNITION OF THE PATIENT'S DIGNITY AS A HUMAN BEING.
